

# **Supplies:**

### Each child will need:

- plastic soap dish
- 2 wiggly eyes
- pompom
- rubber band
- variety of small first-aid items, such as travel-size hand sanitizer, adhesive bandages, antiseptic wipes, and calamine lotion
- index card

#### You'll also need:

- paint markers
- pens
- glue or Glue Dots

## Preparation

Before kids arrive, make a sample Friendly First-Aid Pack. Determine if kids will make these kits for themselves or to give to a local charity.

When children arrive, ask:

If you were away from home and cut your finger, what would you do?

Say: Sometimes you need a little help when you scrape your knee or bump your elbow. Today we'll make little first-aid kits that you can keep with you. Who knows, you might even be able to use your first-aid kit to help a hurting friend! What a fun way to remember that Jesus gives us the power to help others.

## **Craft Creation**

Use paint markers to make a funny, friendly face on the top of the soap dish cover. Add wiggly eyes and a pompom nose, and then set the lid aside to dry.

- **2.** Fill the bottom of the soap dish with first-aid items such as adhesive bandages, hand sanitizer, and antiseptic wipes.
- Write emergency information on the index card. If the kit is for the child, include the home phone number and the phone number of a relative or close friend.
- When the paint on the lid is dry, put the lid on the first-aid kit and use the rubber band to hold the lid in place.
